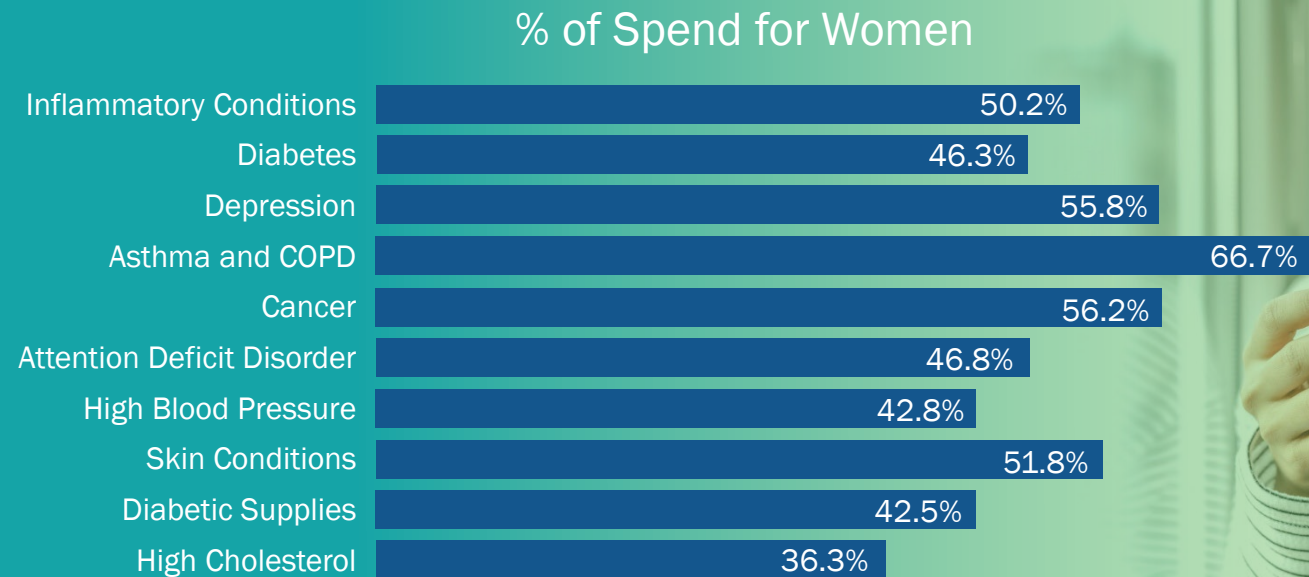

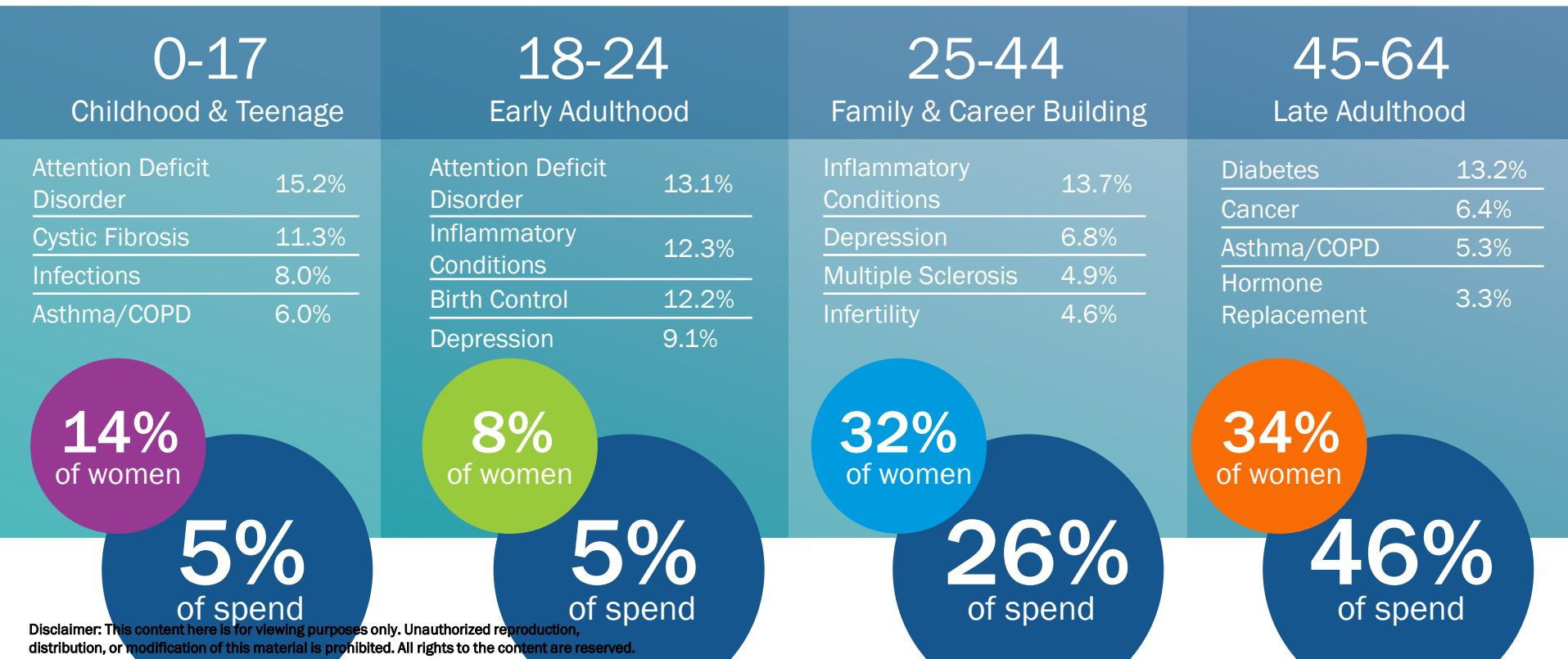
UNLOCKING INSIGHTS: CONDITIONS THAT AFFECT WOMEN

Women's needs vary with age



Migraines more prevalent in women

Over 5 million Canadians

- 2-3 times more prevalent in women

Economic burden ranging from

\$15,651 to \$25,688 per patient per year

- Missed workdays, disability payments, reduced productivity

Preventative vs. Acute treatments

- Triptans (80% of claims volume); CGRPs; Gepants

due to unmanaged symptoms

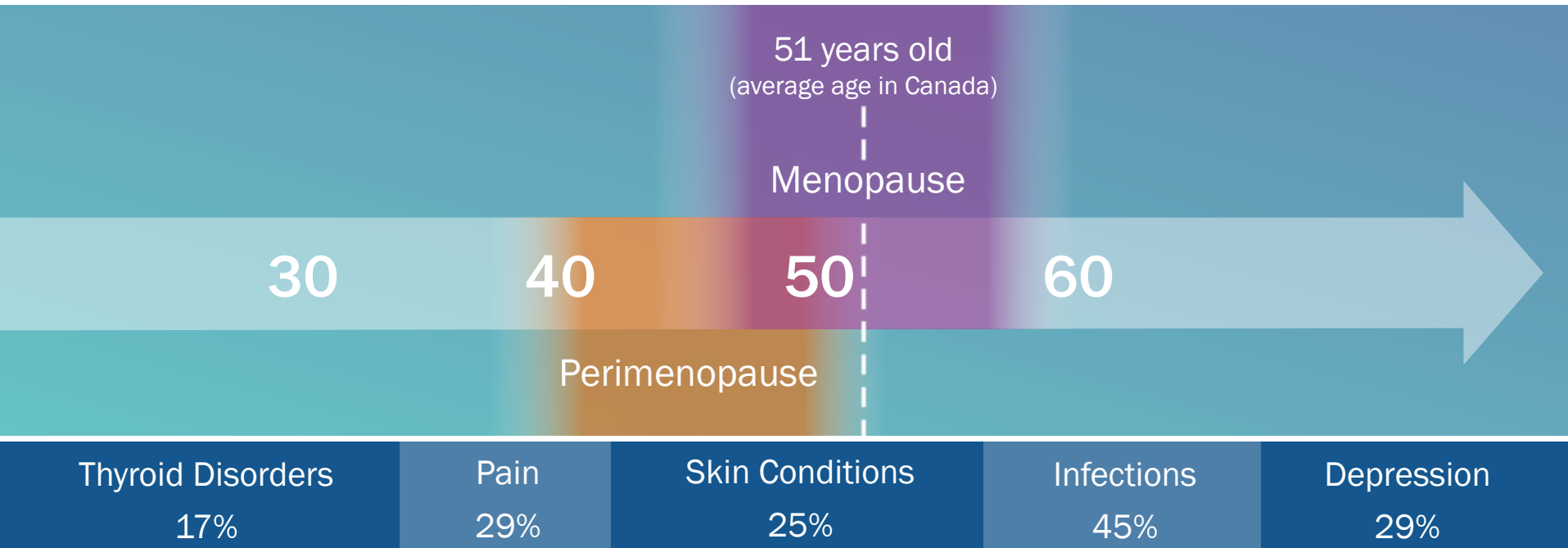

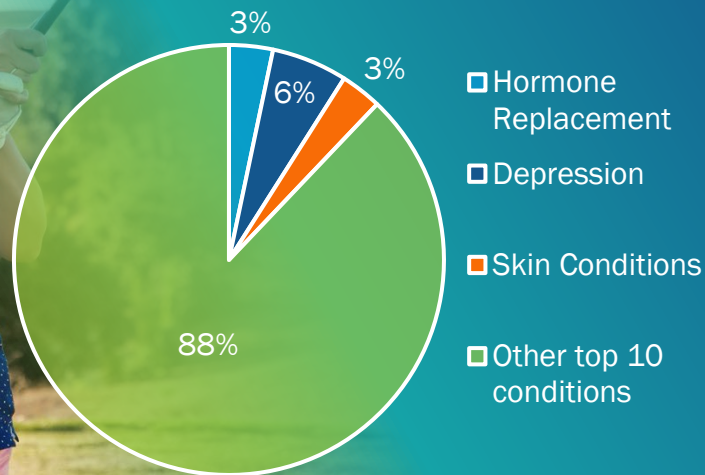
The affects of menopause over time



The cost of menopause

- Hormone Replacement Therapy
 - 8th rank in spend
 - 3% of total spend for age bracket
- Low-cost treatments vs newer alternatives

Relief of vasomotor symptoms;
non-hormonal alternative

Estetrol

Under FDA review;
not yet submitted to
Health Canada

Relief of vasomotor symptoms;
hormonal therapy but evidence
suggest improved benefits and safety
over existing estrogen therapies
